PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Master of Science Programme in Psychology comprises 120 higher education credits, including a Master's thesis of 30 credits. The programme provides specialisation and breadth in the field of psychology. The aim of the programme is to provide you with a Master's degree firmly founded in scientific scholarship and knowledge of current theory and research in Psychology, and offering broad career opportunities. Within the programme, you have the possibility to choose courses within specific subject areas of psychology. Please note that the programme does not lead to a license as a clinical psychologist.

The first semester focuses on theoretical and practical tools for psychology. The students get fundamental knowledge in philosophy of psychology and cognitive science, which encompasses both current areas such as embodied and extended cognition as well as the enduring questions about free will, consciousness and the role of folk psychology. Students participate in day labs with prominent researchers in different fields of Psychology, getting hands-on experience with a range of research methods used in psychological research today. Students will also train in advanced research methods and statistics, including Bayesian statistics.

In the second semester, students choose three of the following advanced theoretical courses: Cognitive Neuroscience, Developmental Psychology, Personality Psychology, Social Psychology, or Work and Organisational Psychology. In addition, all students study the Specialised Topics course, where advanced research skills are trained in a selection of specific focus areas. All courses are studied in parallel, throughout the semester.

In the third semester, students continue their advanced study in the selected fields. The last part of the semester comprises empirical work leading to preparing a research plan or conducting a pilot study. Together, the second and third semester aim at increasing the students' understanding and knowledge of psychology through deepening their knowledge and comprehension of theories and current research, and combining this with practical research experience.

During the fourth semester, students work on a Master's Thesis, further deepening their knowledge of psychology and training in skills of relevance to research, development and scientific investigation in different professional contexts. Importantly, students train independent critical thinking, planning and carrying out a project to completion, as well as advanced communication skills. The Thesis may be an independent project, or part of ongoing, cutting-edge research at the Department of Psychology.

- Deepened knowledge within selected areas in Psychology
- Extensive research skills training
- Flexible structure, elective courses
- Option to write the Master's thesis as part of cutting-edge research projects

CAREER PROSPECTS

A Master's degree in psychology is an excellent foundation for further research within the different fields of psychology. Other common career options are within Research and Development (R&D), managing change or HR, communication or implementation, within different contexts e.g. education, healthcare, social policy, or other industry.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY

Entry requirements

A Bachelor's degree with a major in psychology including at least 15 ECTS credits of psychological research methods and statistics. English Level 6.

How to apply

- 1. Apply online:** Go to www.lunduniversity.lu.se/psychology. Click on "Apply" and follow the instructions for the online application at www.universityadmissions.se, the Swedish national application website. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.
- 2. Submit your supporting documents:**
 - **General supporting documents:** Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.

- **Programme-specific supporting documents:** When applying for this programme, you must also submit a statement of purpose with your application. More information can be found at the programme website: www.psy.lu.se/study/master
- **3. Pay the application fee (when applicable).**

Selection criteria/additional info

Selection is made based on grades from previous studies and on the statement of purpose.
