PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Master's programme in Public Health at Lund University is one of Sweden's most applied for Master's programmes. The programme offers a global classroom environment which is enriched through a synergy of diverse and multi-disciplinary students and staff.

A person's right to the highest attainable standard of health has no geographical or social bounds. However, poverty and lack of democratic governance impede many people's access to this right. In order to abolish health inequalities and achieve sustainable improvements in health and wellbeing, global partnerships and the effective spread of knowledge are essential. We must therefore educate future public health experts who have a broad, interdisciplinary perspective and the will to participate in this global effort.

The programme's focus is thus cross-disciplinary with a consistent global perspective. The programme provides students with evidence-based knowledge and the skills and tools necessary for conducting research, policy-making and promoting health. The teaching and learning approaches used in the programme are dynamic and continuously adapted to an optimized learning environment. As one student expressed it: "The class and teaching are a microcosm of the global context we'll face in work life."

Course leaders and guest lecturers have substantial experience in a range of disciplinary and geographical contexts and originate from countries such as Sweden, Ghana, Iran, Uganda,

and the UK. The diversity and experience of fellow students also contribute to the stimulating learning environment.

PROGRAMME MODULES/COURSES

The programme offers gradual specialisation in three principal areas:

- Health and Society: Global Public Health, Health Economics, Health Policy, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights, Public Health Nutrition
- Theory of Science and Methods of Public Health Science: Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Qualitative Research Methods, Applied Research Methods, Independent Project, Cost-effectiveness and Impact Evaluation of Health Interventions
- Professional Development: Leadership and Professional Perspectives on Public Health, Health Promotion, elective course/internship.

A work placement (internship) is provided in the form of an elective course. Further elective courses may be included in the programme.

Semester 1: Global Public Health 1 (7.5 credits), Global Public Health 2 (7.5 credits), Epidemiology (7.5 credits), Biostatistics (7.5 credits).

Semester 2: Qualitative Research Methods (7.5 credits), Health Policy (7.5 credits), Health Economics (7.5 credits), Health Promotion (7.5 credits).

Semester 3: Elective course 1 or Internship (7.5 credits), Elective course 2 or Internship (7.5 credits), Leadership and Professional Perspectives on Public Health (7.5 credits), Applied Research Methods (7.5 credits).

Semester 4: Master's Thesis in Public Health (30 credits).

CAREER PROSPECTS

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY

Entry requirements

A Bachelor's degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent. English Level 6.

How to apply

1. Apply online:

Go to www.lunduniversity.lu.se/public-health. Click on "Apply" and follow the instructions for the online application at www.universityadmissions.se, the Swedish national application website. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.

2. Submit your supporting documents:

- **General supporting documents:** Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.

- **Programme-specific supporting documents:** In addition to the documents mentioned in Step 2, you must also submit a CV and write a statement of purpose. Make sure you read the checklist for the supporting documents that are required to make a successful application.

3. Pay the application fee (when applicable)

Selection criteria/additional info

The selection will be based on a total assessment of the students' previous academic qualifications, prior work experience in the public health field and a statement of purpose.

Tuition fees

Tuition fee SEK 200 000 per year for non-EU/EEA citizens. See www.lunduniversity.lu.se for details on tuition fees.
