PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Master of Arts Programme in European Studies (aka MAPES) is an interdisciplinary Master's programme with a unique humanist perspective on Europe. The program specifically targets those who are interested in understanding Europe from a broader, humanist, point of view and who want to apply this perspective in careers related to European integration and cultural politics and Europe-wide communication. Our focus lies on culture, identity, history and communication, addressed with both theoretical sophistication and career pragmatism.

Academically, the programme benefits from the presence of the Centre for European Studies, a research-focused network across Lund University. The lectures are given by qualified lecturers with exemplary research and teaching records, as well as by guest speakers from both academia and industry. Thus, our programme offers a solid theoretical foundation for the study of European culture, identity and politics. Furthermore, it develops students' practical skills through a project management course and the possibility of going on an internship.

As a student on this programme, you will learn to:

- understand notions of European culture and history as well as collective identity dynamics
- master the important features of European Union institutions and governance
- focus on the European Union's culture and communication policies and their related areas
- develop project management and communication skills.

PROGRAMME MODULES/COURSES

COMPULSORY COURSES AND NUMBER OF CREDITS: The Meaning of Europe: Culture, Values and Identity (15), Institutions and Governance in the European Union (15), Theory and Methodology (15), Project Management and Communication Strategies (15), Master's thesis (30). ELECTIVE COURSES: vary each year, but always include the possibility to do an internship. Students may also choose elective courses in other relevant fields of the humanities or social sciences.

CAREER PROSPECTS

Our previous generations of European Studies graduates have found jobs at European institutions, governmental organisations, embassies and think-tanks. Many students have obtained relevant experience during their internships with European institutions, NGOs, research institutes and cultural organisations across the continent, both within and outside the EU. Some of the Master alumni have also chosen an academic path as doctoral students.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY

Entry requirements

A Bachelor's degree in the humanities or social sciences, or the equivalent. English Level 6.

How to apply

- Apply online: Go to www.lunduniversity.lu.se/european-studies. Click on "Apply" and follow the instructions for the online application at www.universityadmissions.se, the Swedish national application website. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.
- 2. Submit your supporting documents: Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/ proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.
- **Programme-specific supporting documents:** When applying for the Master's in European Studies, you must also submit a

ABOUT THE CENTRE FOR LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

At the Centre for Languages and Literature (known as SOL), you can study languages, literature, film, European studies and Central and Eastern European studies.
