PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

This interdisciplinary programme offers a comprehensive understanding of contemporary issues in East and South-East Asia, providing you with the knowledge and skills necessary to assess the region's social, cultural, economic, and political developments. Our curriculum is designed to enable you to specialise based on your regional, thematic, and disciplinary focus.

During your studies, you will read courses covering cross-regional issues and an interdisciplinary course on a country or region of your choice in East and South-East Asia. Our programme offers a unique opportunity to travel to Asia during the fourth semester to conduct fieldwork and gather material for your master's thesis.

Our experienced teachers are engaged in both teaching and research and have broad experience in the region. You will be exposed to a diverse range of cross-regional issues. We focus on the development of different countries, as well as the region's importance in international politics.

As a student in this programme, you will develop a range of skills and abilities that are highly valued in today's global job market. You will learn how to analyze complex issues related to social, cultural, political, and economic developments in East and South-East Asia. You will also develop critical thinking, independent research, and creative problem-solving skills. Our programme fosters the ability to work in an interdisciplinary setting and in a multicultural international environment, making you highly adaptable and able to work in a variety of settings. Upon graduation, you will have the skills required to work in

research, government agencies, international organisations, or employment in other qualified capacities.

PROGRAMME MODULES/COURSES

COURSES AND NUMBER OF CREDITS: Semester 1: Introduction to Asian Studies (6 credits), The Economic Transformation of East and South-East Asia (12 credits), Political Systems, Governance, and Democratization in East and South-East Asia (12 credits). Semester 2: Region-specific course, choose between China, Japan/Korea, or South-East Asia (15 credits), International Relations of East and South-East Asia (7.5 credits), Methods in Asian Studies in Theory (7.5 credits). Semester 3: Elective courses (22.5 credits), Methods in Asian Studies in Practice (7.5 credits). Semester 4: Master's Thesis (30 credits).

CAREER PROSPECTS

Graduates of the MSc Programme in Asian Studies have a number of career opportunities available to them. Many graduates continue to doctoral studies at universities throughout Europe and beyond. Some of our students work in government administration, for example, foreign ministries, embassies and various European Union and United Nations agencies. Others obtain employment in civil society organisations around the world, for example, the Asia Foundation, the Red Cross and Oxfam. In the private sector we find our graduates employed as business analysts, consultants, project leaders, project coordinators, business developers, brand managers, company directors, freelance journalists and newspaper editors.

Selection criteria/additional info

Selection of students is based on previous academic achievements and the following criteria:

- Grades on courses
- English language level
- Documented knowledge of and/or interest in the field of Asian Studies and statement of purpose
- Non-academic knowledge and/or work experience of relevance to Asian Studies
