#### **PROGRAMME OVERVIEW**

The MSc in Social Anthropology will provide you with a research-based Master's degree, giving you an understanding of social communities and culture as a coherent whole. The programme combines deep subject knowledge with broad perspectives, preparing you for PhD studies in social anthropology and for advanced professional work.

You will have the freedom to select courses according to interest and future needs. The programme will also stretch your theoretical perspectives and expand your knowledge of qualitative methodology.

## In the programme, you will gain:

- Advanced knowledge and understanding of social anthropology, including both broad knowledge of the field as well as specialised knowledge of certain areas and insight into current research.
- Specialised knowledge of research methods in social anthropology
- The ability to critically and systematically integrate knowledge and to analyse, assess and deal with complex phenomena, issues and situations.
- The ability to identify and formulate research questions critically, autonomously and creatively as well as to plan and, using appropriate methods, undertake advanced tasks within predetermined time frames and so contribute to the formation of knowledge as well as the ability to evaluate this work.

 The skills required for participation in research and development work or autonomous employment in some other qualified capacity.

The programme also offers you the possibility to apply for a double degree with Fudan University in Shanghai. A double degree means that you get two degrees within your two years of study, one degree from Lund University and one from Fudan University. #### Courses and number of credits

Semester 1: Theory and Method Course (15 credits), Ethnography in Social Science (15 credits) Semester 2: Modern Classics (15 credits), Selected courses in research methods given by Graduate School (15 credits) Semester 3: Elective courses of relevance to the programme or Internship or Studies abroad (30 credits) Semester 4: Master's thesis (30 credits)

#### **CAREER PROSPECTS**

Social anthropological competence is based on an inside perspective and on holistic thinking. The programme provides you with both the background knowledge and the practical skills needed to work in a broad range of fields, including governmental, non-governmental and the private sector.

You will be prepared for a future career as a policy maker, a leader or a practitioner working in government agencies, private companies or NGOs, or, alternatively, for doctoral studies and a continued academic career.

## **Entry requirements**

## How to apply

- Apply online: Go to www.lunduniversity.lu.se/social-anthropology. Click on "Apply" and follow the instructions for the online application at www.universityadmissions.se, the Swedish national application website. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.
- 2. Submit your supporting documents:
- General supporting documents: Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/ proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at <a href="https://www.universityadmissions.se">www.universityadmissions.se</a>.
- Programme-specific supporting documents: When applying for the MSc in Social Anthropology, you must also submit a statement of purpose (of around one page) with your application. Find more information on the programme webpage.
- 3. Pay the application fee (when applicable).

The selection is based on academic qualifications and the statement of purpose.
