PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Master of Science in Social Studies of Gender is an interdisciplinary social science Master's programme that aims to provide you with the core elements through which current gender theories and research, in dialogue with established academic disciplines, have contributed to the understanding of broader social processes. The major objective of the programme is to improve your ability to critically examine, evaluate, and discuss the field's most important theoretical perspectives and research results. With these skills in social science and gender analysis, you will be able to formulate and analyse interconnections between theory and practice concerning gender, class, ethnicity, and sexuality.

You will develop skills in critical thinking in relation to social studies of gender and develop theoretical knowledge in your major discipline. You will be trained in various social science methods, both qualitative and quantitative. You will also gain general skills like problem-solving, working in teams, cultural understanding, writing independent reports as well as conceptual, analytical, and evaluative skills. You will be given the chance to take an active part in shaping your education by tailoring your studies to your interests and career goals, especially in the second half of the programme.

There are also good opportunities to go abroad during the third semester and/or take courses at one of the many universities with which we have exchange agreements. You can also take advantage of the possibility to do an internship for one semester, which provides an excellent opportunity to gain work experience. Previous students have, for example, undertaken work placements at embassies and in international NGOs, private companies and the public sector, where a gender perspective is crucial.

PROGRAMME MODULES/COURSES

Courses and number of credits

Semester 1: Gender, Class, Ethnicity and Sexuality course (15 credits), Theory of Science/Research Methods courses (15 credits). **Semester 2**: Critical Feminist Perspectives in Social Theory (15 credits), Research Methods (15 credits). **Semester 3**: Elective courses, Internship, Fieldwork, and/or Studies Abroad (totalling 30 credits). **Semester 4**: Master's degree thesis (30 credits).

CAREER PROSPECTS

The critical social science perspective acquired during the programme, together with in-depth knowledge of theories in your disciplinary background, prepares you for professional work in a variety of fields such as organisational management, development, communication, and social policy. In addition, the programme prepares students for doctoral studies and a continued academic career.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY

Entry requirements

A Bachelor's degree with a major in one of the following social sciences disciplines: development studies, gender studies, human geography, political science, social work, social anthropology, sociology, or sociology of law, or equivalent. A major is equivalent to a minimum of 90 ECTS credits solely within one social science discipline. English Level 6. See www.lumduniversity.lu.se for details on English proficiency levels.

- 2. Submit your supporting documents:
- General supporting documents: Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/ proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.
- Programme-specific supporting documents: When applying for the MSc in Social Studies of Gender, you must also submit a statement of purpose. The programme-specific questions you must answer in your statement of purpose are available on the programme webpage.
- 3. Pay the application fee (when applicable).

Selection criteria/additional info

The applicant's estimated capacity to complete the programme is the primary criterion for selection. Students are selected on the basis of their previous study results (grades on courses and thesis in the Bachelor's degree), proficiency in English, and a statement of purpose. Since this a multidisciplinary programme it is essential to attain an even distribution among different majors within the group. The number of admitted applicants from one major shall not exceed 30% of all students admitted to the programme. Hence the applicant's major will be used as a selection criterion in case of many applicants from one

major. The following main fields of study are eligible as majors: Gender Studies, Development Studies, Human Geography, Political Science, Social Work, Social Anthropology, Sociology, and Sociology of Law.

Tuition fees
