PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Master's programme in Church Music aims to train musicians with excellent artistic, pedagogical and professional abilities.

Focus is placed on developing your instrumental skills and artistic potential. The programme also gives you the pedagogical and psychological insights and skills that working in a church may require. The studies include organ playing, singing, conducting, piano, movement theory, liturgy, and teaching methodology.

After completing the programme you will be able to work either as a soloist, as a member of a fixed ensemble or as a musician within a parish of the Church of Sweden or another congregation. In addition, you will also have acquired thorough entrepreneurial skills that increase your professional versatility in the ever-changing ecclesiastical and cultural life.

During your studies you will have several teaching elements and projects together with other students of Church Music as well as performance studies.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY

Entry requirements

Bachelor's degree in Music or equivalent and approved admission tests.

How to apply

The applications to Malmö Academy of Music's programmes takes place in two steps:

1. Apply online and submit your supporting documents to University Admissions in Sweden:

- Apply online: Go to www.universityadmissions.se, the-Swedish national application website, and find your programme. Click on "Apply" and follow the instructions forthe online application. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.
- Submit your supporting documents: Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and how you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.
- Pay the application fee (when applicable)
- 2. Admission tests: admission tests usually take place in the beginning of March. Find further information about the appli- cation process as well as deadlines and audition instructions for your specialisation on www.mhm.lu.se.

Selection criteria/additional info

Selection of students is based on admission tests.
