Programme overview

The Master's Programme in Music has specialisations in **Composition, Guitar, Harpsichord, Jazz Improvisation, Music Drama – Répétiteur, Piano, Recorder, Symphony Orchestra Instrument, Vocal and Drama Studies, and Vocal Studies.**

The Malmö Academy of Music offers advanced professional first and second cycle programmes for prospective singers, musicians, composers and church musicians to prepare you for work in orchestras and ensembles and for the growing freelance market.

Studies in one of the performance programmes at the Malmö Academy of Music will prepare you for future professional musicianship as a soloist and/or ensemble and orchestra musician. During the period of study, you will develop the knowledge and skills you need in order to work at a high artistic level in a changing and dynamic cultural life in all its forms. We offer education with considerable opportunities to realise your own goals and in parallel build up a strong professional identity that will endure throughout your life as a musician. All our programmes are solid, high-quality professional programmes and the teaching is conducted by a professional and committed team of tutors with in-depth knowledge of the skills and abilities required for active musicianship.

Entry requirements and how to apply

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor's degree in music or equivalent and approved entrance examinations.

HOW TO APPLY

The applications to Malmö Academy of Music programmes take place in three steps:

1. Apply online and submit your supporting documents to University Admissions in Sweden:

- **Apply online:** Go to www.universityadmissions.se, the Swedish national application website. Find your programmes of interest, click on "Apply" and follow the instructions for the online application. Rank the chosen programmes in order of preference.
- **Submit supporting documents:** Check what documents you need to submit (i.e. official transcripts, degree diploma/proof of expected graduation, translations, proof of English, passport) and *how* you need to submit them at www.universityadmissions.se.
- **Pay the application fee** (when applicable).

2. Send work samples to Malmö Academy of Music:

You will need to send samples of work via regular post directly to Malmö Academy of Music. Deadlines and instructions for your specialisation can be found at www.khm.lu.se.

3. Participate in audition/entrance examination:

After the application deadline, selected candidates will be invited to an entrance examination. These usually take place in March each year. The auditions/entrance examinations are held at the Academy located in Malmö and participation is mandatory.
